

Daily Hope is a FREE phone line, **0800 804 8044**, available 24 hours a day. It has been set up for those unable to join online church services during the period of Covid restrictions.

When a caller phones the line they will have a variety of options – they can listen to hymns, or prayers, or a session taking the caller through old hymns and explaining their meaning. They can also listen to a Sunday service. Created by the Church of England and partner groups, it is available for anyone but is designed particularly for people who do not have access to the internet.
